<p>634. <i>Dry Riesling</i> <b>Dönnhoff</b> “Tonschiefer” Nahe, Germany ‘14  <i>Helmut Dönnhoff acquired one of the world’s greatest collections of Riesling vineyards while building his family’s winery into one of the most sought after labels in the world. The Tonschiefer comes from a single vineyard, Leistenberg, in Dönnhoff’s home village of Oberhaus. This is full bodied, but dry, Riesling from the mineral slate &amp; clay vineyard.</i></p>	6	14	62
<p>607. <i>Riesling</i> <b>Leitz</b> Rheingau, Germany ‘15  <i>Johannes Leitz is widely credited for re-establishing the great reputation of Rheingau, historically one of Germany’s top Riesling regions. Leitz produces Riesling from some of the region’s top vineyards, in a style that emphasizes texture and balance while retaining the pure, transparent aromas that the grape is known for. From vineyards in the upper Rheingau, this Leitz bottling is a “feinherb” or very slightly sweet Riesling.</i></p>	4	9	38
<p>637. <i>Riesling</i> <b>Strub</b> Kabinett Nierseiner Bruckchen, Rheinhessen, Ger. ‘13  <i>Kabinett, or “standard harvest” Riesling can be a great example of “tension” between sweet and fruity flavors and crisp acidity. These are wines with sweetness that finish dry, consequently they tend to pair with lots of dishes that we eat. The Bruckchen vineyard is a tremendous place to grow Riesling and show this tension: it is a warm vineyard site that tends to produce ripe Riesling, but with cool, acidity retaining, clay soils.</i></p>	4.5	10	42
<p>638. <i>Riesling</i> <b>Selbach-Oster</b> Spätlese Zeltinger Schlossberg, Mosel, Ger. ‘14  <i>Spätlese, or late harvest, Rieslings have sweetness, richness and power but still retain the definition and acidity to work throughout a meal. This style is great in the cool-climate of the Mosel and few make it as well as the Selbach family. Schlossberg, in the small village of Zelting, is one of Mosel’s most renowned sites and this bottle offers richer flavors of stonefruit and a hint of honeyed botrytis in addition to lots of slate minerality.</i></p>	6.5	15	68

*Chablis makes the most unique and distinctive Chardonnays in the world. Located in the cool, northern most part of Burgundy, France, the region offers Chardonnay of incredible finesse, delicacy and complexity. The signature of the region and the wines is kimmeridge soil, a heavy clay and limestone mix that has a lot of fossilized oyster shells and such in the soil as it is an ancient sea bed. Because the wines tend to be lighter, crisper and more subtle, most wines see very little oak influence. As a result, the wines are really pure and expressive.*

270. Chardonnay **Domaine Pattes Loup** “Vent d’Ange” Chablis ’14  
*Thomas Pico is one of the most revered young winemakers in France. He founded Pattes Loup (trans. “wolf’s paws”) in 2005 in the Chablis hamlet of Courgis. There he was strongly influenced by Alice and Olivier De Moor who taught him to farm organically and make the wines as naturally as possible. He now farms 4 premier cru sites and has an intense following. His wines are exciting examples, with tons of briny minerality, plenty of acidity and structure.*

263. Chardonnay **Gilbert Picq** “En Vaudécorse” Chablis ’14  
*Gilbert Picq and his sons, Didier and Pascal, farm and make their wines in Chichée, just to the south of the town of Chablis. They farm two premier crus, Vosgros and Vaucoupin. Their Vaudécorse comes from a single 2 acre parcel planted in 1980. As the production is small, it is only bottled in years of both exceptional quality and quantity. There isn’t a wood barrel in the winery.*

205. Chardonnay **Domaine Oudin** “Les Serres” Chablis ’13  
*Nathalie Oudin farms 8 hectares in Chichée where she is the Picq’s neighbor. Les Serres is premier cru quality with fruit from Vaugiraut and Vaucoupins vineyards. It’s fermented with native yeasts, aged on lees in stainless steel and bottles with minimal sulfur dioxide. This wine shows some of the broader structure of 2013 with a slightly more exotic fruit character.*
